

WHAT SIDE EFFECTS ARE?

A side effect, also known as an adverse reaction, is defined as: "...any unwanted or unintended symptom or feeling that occurs after medication or treatment initiation..."

Why should you ask for medical help for side effects?

Side effects can range from minor issues, like a dry mouth, to more serious health risks like allergic reactions

Some side effects may indicate a serious health problem that needs treatment Side effects can affect your quality of life and make it difficult for you to continue taking the medication

What are the main causes of a side effect?

Side effects are typically caused by the medicines you are receiving for CLL They occur because treatments often affect healthy cells in addition to cancer cells

Inform your physician about any side effects you are experiencing, especially when they appear after starting a new treatment or have worsened.

What are common side effects of medication?

Nausea, vomiting

Diarrhea


Dizziness

Dry mouth

Fatigue

Changes in appetite or weight

Cough



What is relevant to notice and report about your side effect?

Initiation. When did you first notice your side effect(s)?

Association. Can you associate the side effect with the timing of your medication intake?

Duration. How long do the side effects last? Are they persistent or intermittent? Do they

get worse or better over time?

Frequency. How often do they occur?

Severity. How severe are your side effects?

Impact. Does it impact your daily activities?

Other symptoms. Are there any other new symptoms accompanying these side effects?

Have any new side effects appeared?

Changes. Are there any changes to your existing side effects?

Management. Have you done anything to manage the side effects? If so, did it help?

SIDE EFFECTS

Things that you should ask your physician:

What should I expect? What are the most common side effects of this medication?

What side effects should I contact you about immediately?

What can I do to manage side effects?

How long should I expect side effects to last?

Can I stop taking the medication if I experience severe side effects?

Remember! -

Follow carefully the instructions of your physician for taking your medication.

Ask your physician about potential side effects before starting a new medication.

Keep track of all side effects and report them to your healthcare team.

Do not stop or start any medications without consulting your physician.
